Many people who did not finish high school have knowledge and skills comparable to those who did graduate. By taking and passing a series of five tests in Language Arts Writing, Social Studies, Science, Language Arts Reading, and Mathematics, adults demonstrate they have acquired that level of knowledge.

Most colleges and employers accept a General Educational Development (GED) certificate as being equivalent to a high school diploma. Each year more than 18,000 Washington residents earn their GED credentials.

The State Board for Community and Technical Colleges oversees the GED Testing Program for the State of Washington. Those who meet the eligibility requirements may take the GED tests at official test centers located throughout the state. The test centers are responsible for registering, scheduling, and administering the tests for their area.
