Early Head Start Dental Screening Event

Joshua Krebsbach, Community Health Care

- Dental screening event held July 19 from 7-9pm
- 77 infants/toddlers/adults screened by dentists and hygienists from Community Health Care (CHC)
 - o Included oral health education
 - CHC had schedulers on site to assist families with appointments for urgent needs
 - o Many families are undocumented
 - o CHC will offer a sliding scale fee for families

Early Head Start Update

Donna Andrews, Infant/Toddler Program Manager

- Early Head Start (EHS) has three models
 - o Home Based, 154 slots
 - 20 are in the Parkland area (Franklin Pierce School District)
 - Direct service (staff are PSESD employees)
 - Trinity Lutheran Church offered use of space for office
 - Child Care Partnership
 - New grant as of 2014
 - 160 slots in King & Pierce Counties
 - Full day/full year, subcontracted to sites
 - o WCCW
 - Site at the Washington Correctional Center for Women in Purdy (Gig Harbor)
 - 17 slots, 8 are Center Based & 9 are Home Based
 - PSESD partnered with Department of Corrections and their Residential Parenting Program to offer this model
- Safe sleep training mandatory for EHS staff
- Breastfeeding promotion training will be online for staff by November 30

Family Support/Health & Nutrition Update

James Cooper-Nurse, Family Engagement Manager

- Plans in place for three trainings per year for Family Support staff at centers
- All will be full day trainings
- Planed topics include:
 - ACES study/trauma exposure
 - o Resilience/self-care
 - o Resource fair
 - Lead poisoning prevention
 - 3 breakout sessions

Physical Activity Policy

Katy Levenhagen, Senior Nutrition Coordinator

- Policy approved by Policy Council at their September meeting
- Outlines best practice standards
- Physical Activity guidance user friendly for staff and ideas on how to implement policy
- Training at Annual Health Training
- Guidance & policy are online in the Early Learning Policy Manual (<u>www.EarlyLearningWA.org</u>)

Sunscreen Application

Marie Savage-Hopfauf, Senior Health Coordinator

- What constitutes "inclement weather"?
- Use sunscreen May 1 through October 1
 - o Or when around reflective surfaces, such as snow or water
- Any color of skin can sunburn
- Over the counter medication form used with any medication that has an active ingredient
- As of 2015, districts can apply topical medications to children
- "Block the Sun, Not the Fun" handout will be given to sites
- Families educated to make informed decision about sunscreen
- Will there be multiple applications for full day programs?
 - o Full day used sunscreen more than part day models
 - o Teachers, assistant teachers, aides assist preschoolers in application
 - o Teaching as a "life skill" like brushing teeth or washing hands
 - o Can be put on as a group activity at tables or circle time

Data Overview & 5 Year Goals

Nathalie Jones, Data Services Manager

- Data overview
 - o Early Learning data services uses a continuous cycle of improvement (Plan-Do-Study-Act)
 - Use the ChildPlus database, centers can upload information and documentation directly into database
 - Washington state is developing a P-20 database
- 5 Year Goals overview
 - Information comes from annual assessment
 - Align to agency goals (to eliminate the opportunity gap and become an anti-racist, multicultural organization)
 - Race equity outcome for internal service areas, to become foundation of work rather than an "add on"
 - o School readiness goals, promote healthy habits
 - o CACFP meal patterns will be changing this year
 - Playground safety will be looked at (currently safe for school age children, but not pre-k children)
 - Triage process

- Inclusion of health documents to get "whole photo" of child may be health related issue that us causing behavioral disruptions
- Diversity training for early learning staff

Pharmaceutical Discount Card

Xinying He, Senior Health Coordinator

- Established by Health Care Authority
- For uninsured/underinsured
- Discount card is free to Washington residents
 - o Need name, address, gender
 - No INS/ICE involvement

Community Updates

Community Partners

- Dr. Shorr: influenza activity starting early, nasal flu vaccination pulled, so the shot is the only vaccination available
 - Most drug stores will not vaccinate under 7 years old, will need to visit primary care physician or walk-in clinic
 - Contrary to myth, you cannot get the flu from the vaccination, as it contains a killed virus
 - o If you are already getting sick, you can still get sick before the vaccination is at full strength, although symptoms will be lesser
 - A small portion of population will still contract influenza even after receiving vaccination, however symptoms and length of virus will be decreased
- Vicki Gezon: seeing increase in virus that causes low grade fever, coughing, lasting 3 weeks or more
