- American Indian or Alaskan Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.
- Asian: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent.
- Black or African American: A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa.
- Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
- White/Caucasian: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
- Bi-racial/Multi-racial: A person of two or more races.
- Other: A person reporting a race other than those listed.
- Unspecified: A person whose race is unknown or whose parents declined to identify their race.
